  On lots which have the ability (sufficient acreage) to be subdivided, in accordance with the "standard minimum requirements" shown in the schedule of regulations, a second detached singe-family dwelling shall be permitted subject to the following:

  (a) Both traits must be in common ownership.

  (b) Both muits must have the ability to meet all yard and size requirements.

  (c) If, in the future, the building is to be sold, subdivision approval must first be obtained from the Planning Board.

  7 Trees and other natural vegetation shall be preserved in their natural state a distance of 35 feet from the street ROW line or front property line except as required for the construction of a driveway and other Town-approved purposes.

  The front yard for a lake front lot shall be considered the lake side of the dwelling unit; the rear yard shall be the street side or road frontage.
